





Defining Terms

Water Equity

Equity refers to just and fair inclusion—a condition in which everyone has an opportunity to participate and prosper.

Water equity occurs when all communities have access to clean, safe, affordable drinking water and wastewater services; are resilient in the face of floods, drought, and other climate risks; have a role in decision-making processes related to water management in their communities; and share in the economic, social, and environmental benefits of water systems.



Defining Terms

Vulnerable or Historically Marginalized Communities
Those who face historic or contemporary barriers to economic
and social opportunities and a healthy environment.

For example, communities of color, low-income people, immigrants, seniors, children, people with disabilities, people with limited English-speaking ability, tribal communities, those living in public housing, and currently or formerly incarcerated people.

Opportunities in Water Equity

- Increased funding from ARPA and IIJA mean that lack of funding is less of a barrier than in decades past BUT have to fix existing barriers for this funding to be truly transformative
- Rising interest in Equity in the water sector and in government BUT lots of risk of failure or "equity washing"
- National Water Assistance Programs
 are up and running or in the works
 BUT assistance =/= affordability
